| Purpose

II. Who Must Submit

- 1. one million megawatt hours of total annual sales,
- 2. 100 megawatt hours of annual sales for resale,

III. What and Where to Submit

"Sec. 304.

Every Licensee and every public utility shall file with the Commission such annual and other periodic or special* reports as the Commission may by rules and regulations or other prescribe as necessary or appropriate to assist the Commission in the proper administration of this Act.
